2023 Resources The <u>Pennsylvania Farm to School Network</u> has curated this list of resources to help you celebrate <u>National Farm to School Month</u> this October and spread awareness about the importance of farm to school activities. Educational Activities

- <u>Penn State PRO Wellness</u> compiles resources (including printable educational materials) on an annual basis to help schools celebrate apples in the fall through <u>Apple Crunch</u> (celebrated on Oct. 20) and greens in the spring through <u>Go for the Greens</u> (celebrated in April).
- The <u>Growing Healthy Habits curriculum</u> posted on the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) website aims to use gardening as a tool to teach about nutrition, encourage students to consume more fruits and vegetables, and increase physical activity. Find handouts, lesson plans, a journal entry activity and a taste test for every lesson. Additional lesson plans and printable posters for educators can be found on the <u>Team Nutrition Garden Resources</u> page of the USDA website.
- The Food Trust's <u>Multicultural Collection of Farm to ECE books</u> covers a wide variety of farm to ECE-related topics including gardening, cooking, family meals, farmers markets, shopping for food and more.
- Download <u>Teaching in Nature's Classroom</u>, a free ebook (also available to order in paperback) that presents 15 guiding principles of garden-based education.
- <u>National Ag in the Classroom Agricultural Literacy Curriculum Matrix</u> is a resource for K-12 educators with relevant standards-based instructional resources using agriculture as a context for science, social studies, and nutrition education content.

School Garden Activities

- <u>School Garden Support Organization Network</u> is a peer-to-peer learning network that provides professional and leadership development, resources, and platforms to connect to members serving at a school, district, regional, state, or national level.
- <u>KidsGardening.org</u> offers up fun garden ideas for all ages with downloadable resources and easy to follow step-by-step instructions.
- <u>The Edible Schoolyard (ESY)</u> program has free garden, kitchen, and classroom lesson plans and materials, all searchable by Grade, Subject, and Season on their <u>Resources page</u>.

Serving & Procuring Local Produce

- <u>Pennsylvania Harvest of the Month</u> is a program developed by the Pennsylvania Department of Education and <u>Project PA</u> (Penn State University) to promote a local agricultural product each month.
- The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture created a <u>PA Preferred Seasonality Chart</u>, a visual guide to show which products are in season when in Pennsylvania.
