National Farm to School Month

The [Pennsylvania Farm to School Network \(PFSN\)](#) has curated this list of resources to help you celebrate [National Farm to School \(FTS\) Month](#) this October and spread awareness about the importance of farm to school activities. Activities for K-12 and Early Care and Education Educators

- [Penn State PRO Wellness](#) compiles resources (including printable educational materials) on an annual basis to help schools celebrate apples in the fall through [Apple Crunch](#) (celebrated in October) and greens in the spring through [Go for the Greens](#) (celebrated in April).
- [Pennsylvania Harvest of the Month](#) (PA HOM) is a program developed by the Pennsylvania Department of Education and [Project PA](#) (Penn State University) to promote a local agricultural product each month. Use the [PA HOM Activity Guides](#) to support your educational activities in the classroom when celebrating the local agriculture product each month.
- The [Growing Healthy Habits curriculum](#) posted on the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) website aims to use gardening as a tool to teach about nutrition, encourage students to consume more fruits and vegetables and increase physical activity. Find handouts, lesson plans and a taste test for every lesson. - [The Edible Schoolyard \(ESY\)](#) program has free garden, kitchen, and classroom lesson plans and materials, all searchable by Grade, Subject, and Season on their [Resources page](#).

Activities for Child Nutrition Program Operators

- The [Pennsylvania Harvest of the Month: In the Kitchen](#) video series has recently been released. These short (approximately 5-7 minutes) videos are designed to provide information about how to procure, select, handle and prepare each PA HOM item for Child Nutrition Programs (CNP). They can be incorporated into training sessions for CNP staff or used for individual-level learning to facilitate the implementation of the PA HOM program in CNPs. This initiative is a win-win-win scenario, fostering economic growth, improving public health outcomes, and nurturing stronger communities, all while nourishing Pennsylvania's children with the nutrition they require to thrive.
